ASSESSING RISK



Our management of risk typically involves a comprehensive evaluation of potential risks and threats to an individual or group. The assessment considers factors such as profile, lifestyle, and itinerary, as well as the current security environment in which we are likely to operate. The assessment will typically include the following elements:

Identification of potential threats: This includes identifying parties that may pose a threat to the client, such as stalkers, disgruntled employees, etc.

1. Identification of potential threats: The route planner will consider the identified risks and threats from the close protection risk assessment and adjust the route to avoid areas of known danger.

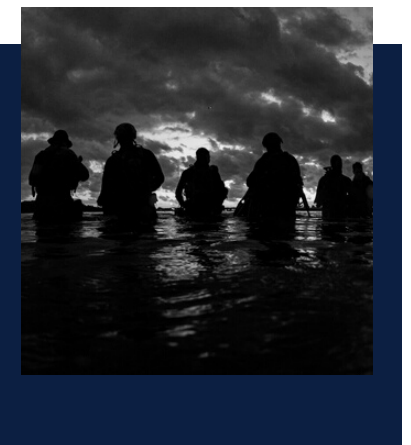

SECURITY DETAIL
